#### August 23, 2023

#### 2023 Legislative Session

- Key legislative deadlines upcoming
  - August 14 Legislature returned from Summer recess
  - September 1 Fiscal committee deadline
  - September 14 Legislature adjourns only 15
    legislative session days remaining this year
  - October 14 Governor completes action on legislation



#### State Budget

- State Budget and primary budget trailer bills approved on June 27
  - Resources budget trailer bill approved
    - \$600 M in extended arrearages funding for water systems (from June 15, 2021 through December 31, 2022)
  - Governor's infrastructure-related budget trailer bill proposals
    approved by Legislature
    - **SB 146:** Progressive design-build authority for DWR
    - SB 147: Fully protected species reclassification
    - **SB 149:** CEQA Expedited judicial review and Administrative record streamlining
- Sweetwater Authority budget allocation included in final budget package (AB 102)
  - \$750,000 for Loveland Reservoir trail restoration project secured by Senator Brian Jones
    - 37 (21) \$750,000 for Streetwater Authority for planning, design,
    - 38 and construction activities related to trail system restoration at
    - 39 Loveland Reservoir.



### **Assembly Leadership Transition**

- Assemblymember Robert Rivas transition to Assembly Speaker role on July 1
  - Speaker Anthony Rendon has transitioned to "Speaker Emeritus" role
  - Most of Rendon policy staff have also transitioned out of Speaker's office
- New leadership team
  - Speaker Pro-Tem: Assemblymember Cecilia Aguiar-Curry (Davis)
  - Assembly Majority Leader: Isaac Bryan (Los Angeles)
- Committee leadership and composition changes expected likely following adjournment of 2023 session
  - Announced to-date
    - Assm. Esmerelda Soria Chair of Assembly Agriculture Committee
    - Assm. Juan Carrillo Chair of Assembly Local Government Committee
    - Assm. Gail Pellerin Chair of Assembly Elections Committee

### **Resources/Climate Resilience Bond**

- AB 1567 (Garcia)
  - \$15.995 B total
    - \$5.225 B for drought, flood, and water resilience
  - March 2024 primary election ballot
- SB 867 (Allen)
  - \$15.5 B total
    - \$5.2 B for drought, flood, and water resilience
  - March 2024 primary election ballot

Increasing indications that the resources/climate resilience bond measure will be pushed to the <u>November 2024</u> general election ballot
